	a. Approach objective: for recommendation to come from the public

	3. Discussed detailed approaches for each topic	
	a. All task forces will start with relevant research for each group provided by the	
	consulting team	
	<ul><li>b. Task force objectives:</li><li>i. Get arguments on both side and acknowledge and incorporate points</li></ul>	
	ii. Be sure to mitigate legitimate concerns	
	c. Requested subject matter experts on each task force	
	d. Requested that roles be identified on the task forces and strong facilitation be	
	provided	
	e. Subject matter research from multiple sources will be provided	



- f. Actual dates for meetings of each task force need to be identified
- g. Next step will be working through logistics specific to each task force to identify time commitment
- h. If it is too much additional time is there another way to approach these topics?
- 4. Discussed other items associated with the Task Force Approach
  - a. School size and class size will focus on ideal and inform the other approaches. Actual school size could be revisited during the process.
  - b. School size, location and grade alignment have components of idealism but they are impacted by the context and practical realities of the community and the task forces will need to consider both
  - c. Information will be provided with source materials
  - d. The Superintendent's voice needs to be represented in the task force process
  - e. Provide research around districts of the same size
  - f. Open enrollment is a big issue associate with growth and needs to be considered
  - g. Start times is still in the parking lot
    - i. Traffic ties to school start times
    - ii. Not addressing start times may alienate people
    - iii. Start times have broader implications
    - iv. There was some disagreement on start times being a part of this process because it is a difficult topic and a complexity that upends other discussions
    - v. Students have been flexing their own start time with their schedules
    - vi. Final recommendation: review start times with the City and County in a transportation discussion
  - h. Don't want financial impacts of the master plan to impact operational budget
  - i. Is there enough time for the work, specifically on school location and grade alignment?
  - j. Public reaction from the public at the Open House in February will be incorporated into the discussions
  - these Task Forces will give recommendations but will not be responsible for the final decisions and these recommendations will be scrutinized by the public
  - I. Expressed that these were the steps that were missing in the last process
  - m. Goals for each group must be specifically identified to control scope of the discussions in order to make progress efficiently
  - n. The county and city should be involved in any transportation discussions
  - o. CTE is not being addressed in the Task Force format. It will be addressed in the Ed Spec with vocational approaches
  - p. Past work will be the starting place for each of these topics
  - q. Location of Pre-K will be part of grade alignment
- 5. The Steering Committee endorsed this approach with response to their comments
- 6. Next step is to edit the approach and finalize
- 7. Consulting Team requested that Steering Committee member provide names for task force members by email or on the back of the evaluation forms
