On Monday, October 29, the District held a Community Engagement Open House to introduce the *Future of Learning* education master planning process to the public. Nearly 100 people participated in one of two sessions held at Sheldon Richins. During the open house, attendees shared their ideas and input on the 9-month planning process.



On Tuesday, October 30, the District held an all-day summit with 75 students, parents, teachers, principals, and business leaders to discuss what students need in the future to be successful learners. The major themes that emerged from the discussion were to make student-centered learning a top priority, build relationships and trust, have meaningful engagements, provide a positive, healthy and safe learning environment that is flexible and adaptable, and commit to an inclusive community. The information received during the summit and open house will be shared with the Steering Committee at their meeting on November 6.
