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Criteria Brainstorming

- Maintain/improve community centered campus atmosphere
 - o Proximity and connection to Park City
 - o Proximity of campus buildings
 - o Diversity of student body
 - Socio-economic
 - Life experiences
 - Personal interests
- Improve vehicle circulation
 - o Safer and more efficient traffic patterns for buses and personal vehicles
 - o Improved pedestrian and bicycle safety
 - o Lower traffic congestion on Kearns Blvd
 - o Ensure connectivity between campus buildings
- Create flexible spaces
 - o Interior and exterior
 - o Spaces should maximize options for teachers and students
 - o Spaces should accommodate potential future changes
- Develop outside partnerships
 - o Interface with higher education providers

What Works

- Ease of access to programs at high school
- Eccles facility connected to high school
- Campus proximity to Park City

What Doesn't Work

- Vehicle circulation is inefficient and unsafe
- Insufficient supervision and regulation of vehicular traffic during pick-up and drop-off times
- Lack of adequate pedestrian or bicycle safety provisions
- Difficulty of travel between campus buildings
- Lack of on-campus athletic facilities
